#### 1.WOMEN EMPOWERMENT

ITALIAN EPISCOPAL CONFERENCE, ROMA, ITALY.

PROMOTION FOR WOMEN- FOOD SECURITY AND LIVELIHOOD SUPPORT-PROJECT NO: IEC 0254/2022.

The livelihood program is exclusively designed for the women of Kadur and TarikereTaluks in Chikmagalur District. The programme aims to empower and uplift the women and their families economically. We have created awareness to 1800 beneficiaries on sessions like promotion of kitchen garden, soft skills, time management, budgeting and finance. 328 families have started income generation activities and 723 families enjoy healthy living through promotion of kitchen garden. The project expanded its goal to create awareness on cancer. As a result a training session was organized at the organization level to the members of the staff. 30 staff participated in the training. 14 training sessions were conducted at the grassroot level. 721 women participated in the trainings. They enhanced their knowledge on early detection and prevention methods. Participants reported higher confidence in recognizing symptoms and a greater willingness to seek regular screenings.



#### **Livelihood Support**

110 women received financial support of Rs.25,000/-each towards livelihood and are enjoying food and income security through self-employment

Empowerment of Adolescent girls is an ongoing programme. It's a very enriching journey of growth, learning and empowering together with theteens and the teachers. 1785 children and teachers were provided insights into hygiene practices, health awareness, nutritious food choices and child rights. We aim to improve their physical health, promote dignity, confidence and gendere quality among our children. We distributeds anitary kits to 630 girls, while all boys, girls and the teachers received clothnapkins and nutritious peanut cakes.



ARCHDIOCESE OF CARITAS PRAGUE, CZECH REPUBLIC – CALL FOR PROJECT PROPOSALS - 2022 LIVELIHOOD SUPPORT FOR THE PARENTS OF CHILD SPONSORSHIP PROGRAMME CHILDREN.

It's a holistic programme where economic and social needs are addressed. 75 parents of our sponsored children were supported with livelihood initiatives. Orientation to selected parents was given by the experts at the organizational level in 3 batches. 3 Children camps were organized. 141 children participated in the camp. The children had a wonderful opportunity for social interaction, development of teamwork skills, and exposure to new activities and experiences which helped them to grow physically, mentally and creatively. The children created lasting memories with lot of fun, singing, dancing and playing.

B.H. MISEROR THROUGH KROSS – EMPOWERMENT OF SOCIO ECONOMICALLY DISADAVANTAGED POPULATION IN KARNATAKA.

#### Project No. 321-908-1077 ZG

The program is implemented in Hassan, Sakleshpura and Arsikere Taluks of Hassan Districts. 141 women self-help groups, 7 cluster federations and one district federation are functioning. 72 training sessions were conducted. 2396 women increased their knowledge on Climatic Change, Roof Water Harvesting, Existing Acts/ Laws, Domestic Violence, Women Atrocities, Women Rights, Right Based Approach, Leadership and Personality Development, Health and Hygiene, Entrepreneur Awareness Programme, Entrepreneur Development Programme and Cancer Awareness. 64 women have emerged as women leaders at the local committees. Five cases against women atrocities and abuses against women have been referred to the Arsikere and Hassan Mahaila Santvana Kendra and resolved. Two Children were saved through child help line at Shanthigramma and one girl was saved from child marriage at Anniganahalli.

#### 2. EDUCATION:

# ARCHDIOCESE OF CARITAS PRAGUE, CZECH REPUBLIC: CHILD SPONSORSHIP PROGRAM (CSP)

Child Sponsorshipprogramme is implemented in the districts of Hassan and Chikmagalur. 241 children are enrolled in the programme. Christmas, Easter and Annual Progress Report letters are sent to the donors every year. The financial support is directly credited to the child's bank account towards education. 10 children received special gifts worth Rs.88,900/-. Christmas gettogether for children and parents was conducted in Chikmagalur, Kadur and Hassan in the month of December. 216 children with their parents enjoyed the celebrations, cultural activities, collected Christmas cake and gifts.



#### **Educational Tour:**

Educational tour was organized on 13th April and 16th April 2023. The children visited historical places like Belur and Halebeedu in Hassan District. Pushpagiri temple and Mahatma Gandhi Park in Chikmgalur district.



#### ONG, MADRE TERESA, SPAIN:

#### MAINTENANCE OF NIRMALAHIGH SCHOOL BOARDING M. DASAPURA:

ONG Madre Teresa, Spain with its generosity and support has helped us to reachout to the unreached children by providing them with food, clothing, books & stationary. The children were given inputs on hygiene and health, personality development, leadership qualities and time management skills. The continuous support has inspired the children with enhancing knowledge, skills and physical activities. 35 boys are studying in the boarding house from class 8 to class 10.



#### 3.DISABILITY:

#### ENABLE INDIA BENGALURU - GARV - SE CENTER CMSSS:

CMSSS Garve Se centre is basically for the people living with disabilities across the districts of Hassan and Chikmagalur. The programme is to create sustainability and ecofriendly environment for the people with disability. In order to reach more and more people with disabilities we have extended our work to My soreand Shimoga District.

#### Achievements:

- 1. Mrs. Mahalakshmi from Channarayapatna received a cash prize of Rs. 5000/-anda shield from Enable India for her achievement as a best entrepreneur of the year among the people living with disabilities.
- 2. 15 People with disabilities who had attended the EDP training sessions were supported with solar energy equipment's costing Rs.45,000/-each.
- 3. 32PwD sreceived Wheelchairs from ProVision Asiaand 15PwDs havedone UDIDcards

#### Trainings:

- Entrepreneur Development Program was conducted at Rural Self Employment Training Institutes (RSETI) in 2 batches for 10 days. 61 people with disabilities (PwDs) attended the training and received the benefits. 55 PwDs have begun income generation activities like cow rearing (25Nos), Petty shop (10 Nos), Goat rearing (15 Nos), Small business likes vegetable selling, fruits selling, and plastic shop(5Nos).
- Computer and Employability skill training was conducted in 2 batches for 48 PwDs. The trained PwDs are now working locally at the Cyber centre.



#### 4. HEALTH

#### SPARSHA-INSTILLING HOPE

Sparsha instilling hope is a campaign against the deadly disease Cancer started in the year 2019-20 to cater to the needs of the cancer patients, create awareness in the community in collaboration with the schools, religious, institutions, likeminded GOs and NGOs, Now, it has become a movement. It also includes aspects such as promotion of kitchen garden, identifying cancer patients and providing them with moral and financial support. Organizing Cancerday Rallies and Health/Medical Camps.

#### Awareness on Cancer

485 self help group women were given awareness on cancer in the districts of Hassan and Chikmgalur. The sessions helped them to enhance their knowledge on the symptoms of cancer, reasons, types of cancer, how to lead a healthy life style by producing their own produce in the backyards/kitchengarden.

#### Health Camps

159 members participated in the health camp and got to know about their health status. (Blood Sugar and Blood Pressure). The PHC Doctors, Health/Ashaworkers, Members of the Panchayath were a part of this programme. 80 members got free eye check-up. 2 members were referred to HIMS for eye surgery. The youth came forward to donate bloodin Chikmagalur and Magge during the camps.

#### Transforming Lives

In a small close-knit community called Indavara, Hukkunda village in Chikmagalur district, the much anticipated Health Camp provided health checkup for 117 people, promising to bring hope, care and transformation to the lives of its participants. This event was organized by Chikmagalur Multipurpose social Service Society (CMSSS) and agroup of volunteers. One of the most heart warming aspects of health camp was the spirit of the youth towards the well-being of others. Nine young individuals bravely volunteered up to donate blood. Their selfless act not only replenished the local blood bank but also set an example of compassion and empathy that inspired others.

Another crucial service offered at the camp was eye check-ups. 51 participants availed this opportunity having their vision tested and receiving valuable advice and guidance on maintaining healthy eyes. Many of them were unaware of existing vision problems and for them, this was a life-changing experience. The impact of Health Camp was not just about addressing immediate health concerns; it fostered a sense of community and unity. Neighborsmet, shared stories and offered support to each other. The eventstrengthened social bonds, creating a stronger more resilient community. The health camp not only

improved the physical health of its participants but also rejuvenated the spirit of the entire community, leaving a lasting legacy of care and unity. The beneficiaries expressed their heartfelt thanks to the Administration of Holy CrossHospital Chikmagalur and CMSSS for organizing this event.



# CONSTRUCTION OF A PRAYER HALL AND 6 RESIDENTAL ROOMS AT THE TOP OF CMSSS BUILDING:

This project is supported by the Arch Diocese of KOLN GERMANY with INR 40,26,000/for the construction of a prayer hall and 6 residential rooms. The construction work commenced in the month of November 2023 and the work is in progress.



CENTRE FOR CHILD AND LAW, NATIONAL COLLEGE OF LAW, BANGALORE Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT Study): A Focus group discussion was held on 31-10-2023 in collaboration with the Centre for Child and National college of Law, Bengaluru in CMSSS Mr. Mahesh Tauro was the Coordinator. 40 members from various departments enriched their knowledge. Rev. Fr. Shantharaj R, the Director of CMSSS, District Deputy Director, Dept of Food & Civil Supplies, Food Inspectors, Fair Price Shop Owners, Jagrutha Samithi members, Priority Household Ration Card holders, Antyodaya Anna Yojana card holders and the community educators of CMSSS were present.





#### MASS AWARENESS TO GENERAL PUBLIC ON HUMAN TRAFFICKING AND DRUG ABUSE

A group of Bikers from India and abroad in association with Oasis Mumbai in collaboration with CMSSS and Jeevandhara Sevakendra, Hassan with their banner Mukthi Bike Challenge travelled all the way from Bangalore to Mumbai with a crewof 30 members. They organized street plays during their journey. They educated the people of Hassan on 23-10-2023 against human trafficking and drug abuse through an amazing street play at Pension Mohalla, Hassan.





#### AZIM PREMJI FOUNDATION, BENGALURU – FIELD IMMERSION PROGRAM:

CMSS Shosted 9 students from Azim Premji Foundation, Bengaluru who are pursuing M.A in development From September 25th to 7th October 2023. This is to enable the students to relate and engage with people inrural and urban communities from an observer's point of view. The students visited and met the officials of schools run by the Government and Private Sector, Public Health Centres, Anganwadis, Grama Panchayats, Women headed families, Widows, Children, Youth, farmers, Federations and Women who are engaged in small scale business.









#### GENERAL BODY AND GOVERNING BOARD MEETINGS:

There are 13 members in the General Body and 7 members in the Governing Board of CMSSS. One Annual General Body Meeting and 4 Governing Board Meetings are held every year. The Bishop of Chikmagalur Rt. Rev. Dr. T. Anthony Swamy is the President, Msgr. Elias Sequeira is the Vice President, Rev. Fr. Shantharaj R is the secretary/Treasurer. The Governing board meetings are essential for providing leadership, direction and accountability of the organization, ensuring that it remains focused on its mission and operates effectively.





#### **ALYWN CORPUS:**

Mr. Alywn S Rodrigues is an Estate Owner in Javali of Chikmagalur district residing in Mangalore. He collaborated with CMSSS in the year 2014 with an aim to help the poor and backward community in the Diocese of Chikmagalur with the Aid for food, clothing, education, medical, housing, oldage and marriage with the interest earned from the Seed capital. During the year the we have disbursed Rs. 55,000/- Oldage, Rs.1,24,000/- housing, Rs.30,000/- Marriage, Rs.1,00,000/- Medical Aid and Rs.184,000/- towards Education.

#### JEEVAN JYOTHI FEDERATION (JJF)

Jeevan Jyothi Federation was registered in Hassan under the Cooperative Societies Act, 1960 bearing registration No. 100/16-17. As of now the federation function with 17 independent board members and quarterly meetings are conducted to discuss on the issues and future of the federation. Jeevan Jyothi Federation is the mother federation of 25 cluster federation in 13 blocks and having 486 SHG's consisting 5718 Women. Rs.1,97,65,000/- loan is disbursed for productive and non-productive purposes to 125 self-help group members where 122 women have utilized the loan for productive purpose and 82 women for non-productive purpose. The amount recovered during the year is Rs.1,94,87,437/-.















#### JEEVAN JYOTHI STREESHAKTHI SOUHARDHA SAHAKARI SANGHA NIYAMITHA(JJSSSN):

Jeevanjyothi Streeshakti Souharda Sahakari Niyamitha was registered on December 20, 2021, under Section 5(3) of the Karnataka State Federal Cooperative Societies Act 1997 with its registration number 5381/2021-22. Rev. Fr. Shantharaj R., is the Chief Executive Officer, Mrs. Bhagyamary is the President. There are 14 Directors in the board. There are 1895 primary shareholders and 20 secondary shareholders. Rs.78 lakhs is mobilized as term deposit. Rs.2,54,50,000/- is disbursed to women of 52 self-help groups for productive and non productive purpose. The Souhardha Sahakari has initiated activities like candle making unit, catering.

Annual Day celebration of Jeevan Jyothi Streeshakthi Souharda Sahakari(JJSSSN) and Jeevan Jyothi Federation (JJF)

On 17-10-2023 the 2nd Annual day celebration of JJSSSN and the 24th Annual Day of JJF was held in the grounds of St. Francis Xavier School, Magge, Alur Taluk. 1000 and above women participated in the event. Mrs. Bhagyamary is the President of JJSSSN and Mrs. Laisa Joy is the President of JJF. The member of Legislative Assembly Mr. Cement Manju, Rev. Fr. Anil Pais, the Parish Priest of Magge, Rev. Fr. Shantharaj R the Director of CMSSS, Officials of the Government departments, elected members of the local governance, the women of self help groups from Hassan and Chikmagalur districts, the staff of CMSSS and the public were present for the program. The women were encouraged and motivated to enhance their skills and knowledge and motivated to continue income generation activities.
