

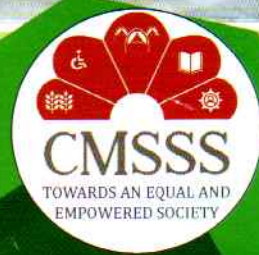

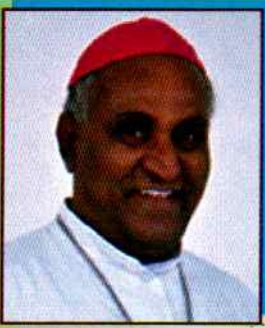

1. WOMEN EMPOWERMENT

ITALIAN EPISCOPAL CONFERENCE, ROMA, ITALY: 254/2022- PROMOTION FOR WOMEN- LIVELIHOOD SUPPORT

The livelihood program exclusively designed for women of Kadur and Tarikere Taluks in Chikmagalur Districts has been launched on 19-01-2023 at Kallathipura and on 24-01-2023 at Kadur. Aiming to empower and uplift them economically. This program provides comprehensive trainings, resources and mentorship opportunities to equip women with the necessary skills and knowledge to thrive in various income generating activities and create sustainable livelihoods.

1. Training on Identification of skills.

Training on identification of skills to beneficiaries has provided them with valuable knowledge, resources and opportunities for personal and professional development. The beneficiaries are facing crucial problems like managing time, handling finance and budgeting. The training has helped the beneficiaries with low income, how to face unique challenges by providing them with tools to manage their finances effectively, which helped them to manage resources efficiently and improve their overall quality of life. The training sessions have helped women to overcome challenges, pursue opportunities and become agents of change in their own lives and communities.



ONG MADRE TERESA, SPAIN: EMPOWERMENT OF ADOLESCENT GIRLS

Through the generous contribution from the ONG Madre Teresa, Spain, has made significant strides in empowering adolescent girls through training on health and hygiene. Additionally we successfully distributed sanitary kits to 800 children across 12 areas in Hassan and Chikmagalur Districts. which included sanitary pads, cotton towels, soaps and peanut cakes.

Training on Health and Hygiene:

CMSSS recognized the importance of educating adolescent girls about health and hygiene practices to promote their overall well-being and reduce the prevalence of preventable diseases. To address this we conducted training sessions in collaboration with local schools and community centers.

1. Menstrual Hygiene : We focused on breaking the stigma surrounding menstruation and providing comprehensive information on menstrual health, including proper hygiene practices, managing menstrual discomfort and the effective use of sanitary products.



Personal Hygiene : We emphasized the significance of maintaining personal hygiene through sessions on hand washing, dental care and regular bathing in order to prevent infections and promoting good health.



B.H. MISEROR THROUGH KROSS - EMPOWERMENT OF SOCIO ECONOMICALLY DISADAVANTAGED POPULATION IN KARNATAKA - 321-908-1077 ZG

The program is implemented in Hassan District covering Hassan, Arsikere and Sakleshpura Taluks. 138 women self-help groups are functioning with a membership of 1850. 1439 members have participated in 60 different training sessions on women and child rights, kitchen gardening, organic farming, climate change, waste management, entrepreneur awareness program, entrepreneur development program, strengthening of self-help groups, cluster level federations and district level federations. The program has facilitated applications for drinking water supply in Gadenahalli and Melgodu, which has benefited the community. Eight cases against atrocities and abuses against women have been referred to the Mahila Santhvana Kendra and amicable settlement is done. The families are living together keeping aside their differences.



**ARCHDIOCESE OF CARITAS PRAGUE, CZECH REPUBLIC –
CALL FOR PROJECT PROPOSALS - 2022 LIVELIHOOD SUPPORT
FOR THE PARENTS OF CHILD SPONSORSHIP CHILDREN.**

Through our dedicated efforts, we have continued to empower the parents of sponsored children with various forms of support, fostering economic growth and enhancing the well-being of the families we serve.

One of the key achievements this year was providing support for small business investments to parents. 39 families are supported with small business investments like tailoring unit, petty shop, canteen, vegetable and fruit selling's, men's hair dressing, ladies beauty parlour, mobile shop, xerox shop, flower business, and broom business by offering financial assistance, training and mentorship, we enabled parents to start their own business/expand the existing ones. This initiative generated income for the families and also instilled a sense of entrepreneurship and self-reliance within the community.

We recognized the importance of animal husbandry as a sustainable means of livelihood for many families. 20 families are supported with cow rearing and 16 families are supported with goat rearing. Through our support programs, parents were able to receive training in Animal care, access to veterinary services and acquire necessary resources. This empowered them in contributing to their economic stability and long-term resilience. Our commitment to the holistic development of sponsored children extended beyond economic empowerment. We have planned three camps for children in the next financial year. Recognizing the vital role parents play in the upbringing of their children, we conducted orientation for parents. The sessions focused on equipping parents with knowledge and skills related to child development, nutrition, health and education..



ARCHDIOCESE OF CARITAS PRAGUE, CZECH REPUBLIC: CHILD SPONSORSHIP PROGRAM (CSP).

267 children are enrolled in the child sponsorship programme and are receiving the benefits. The children are distributed with school /tuition fees, school requirements like books and stationeries and school bag.

Child camp and Christmas get together was organized for children and their parents. 92 children participated in the two days children camp organized at CMSSS from 15th October 2022 to 16th of October 2022. The input sessions were on leadership, health and hygiene, writing letters to their donors, yoga, meditation besides singing, dancing and cultural activities. 239 children actively participated in the Christmas get together program held at Holy Family Church, Vijayapura and Perpetual Succour Church Hall, Kadur, Chikmagalur District and at CMSSS, B. Katihalli, Hassan, Hassan District. The guests of honour delivered messages on the meaning and importance of Christmas celebrations. The Children came forward to sing carols, dance and made the event successful by cutting the Christmas cake and enjoying the same. All the children received cake and gifts. The parents and children were given a sumptuous meal at the end of the program along with Christmas cake.



ONG, MADRE TERESA, SPAIN : MAINTENANCE OF NIRMALA HIGH SCHOOL BOARDING:

Nirmala High School Boarding, M. Dasapura is supported by ONG Madre Teresa which aims to provide quality education and accommodation to poor children, giving them a chance for a brighter future. There are 24 children in the boarding. Besides their academics these children are taught discipline, respect for each other, moral values and brought up in spirituality. All the 24 boarders have come out colorful in the academics with 100% result.



3. DISABILITY

ENABLE INDIA BENGALURU - GARV - SE CENTER CMSSS:

The Garv se center (GSC) aims to be one stop solution for People with Disabilities (PwDs) to gain knowledge and access to any type of disability related services. It focuses on creating rural PwD entrepreneurs by generating self-employment opportunities and co-creating concrete business plans. Village level committees with multiple stakeholders are formed for the sustainability of the people with disability.

GSC organized 2 trainings for 10 days each at RSETI Hassan and COBSET Chikmagalur on Entrepreneur Development Program (EDP) trainings for 43 PwDs who are interested to take up income generating. After the training 15 of them have taken up Cow rearing, 5 of them Goat rearing, 10 of them have put up petty shops and 8 are having small businesses like vegetable selling and fruits selling. 48 PwDs are trained at computer skills and are now working locally at cyber, shops and other local places. All the 91 PwDs trained are employed and are engaged in different livelihood activities by linking them to bank and government departments to avail their entitlements.



4. HEALTH

CARITAS INDIA, NEW DELHI- SPARSHA - INSTILLING HOPE

The past year has been marked as a commitment to fight against cancer and create awareness among stakeholders. Our comprehensive campaign focused on multiple aspects including raising awareness about cancer, promoting organic farming and kitchen gardens, identifying cancer patients, providing them with financial support, organizing medical camps and commemorating Cancer day through rallies. Through these initiatives, we aimed to empower individuals, communities and organizations to join hands in the fight

against cancer. We conducted extensive awareness campaigns targeting various stakeholders, including individuals, families, schools and workplaces. We emphasized the importance of early detection, healthy lifestyles and the significance of regular screenings. Our efforts aimed to empower stakeholders with knowledge about cancer prevention and the available support systems.

We worked closely with the grass root level people to identify individuals battling cancer who were in need of financial assistance. The care takers of the patients were provided with financial support for their medical treatments.

To Commemorate Cancer Day and raise awareness at a broader scale, we organized rallies in collaboration with local communities, institutions and organizations. These rallies brought together individuals affected by cancer; survivors, caregivers and others. Participants marched together showcasing their solidarity in the fight against cancer and spreading messages of hope, strength and encouragement.



ALYWN CORPUS:

Mr. Alywn S Rodrigues is an Estate Owner in Javali of Chikmagalur district residing in Mangalore. He collaborated with CMSSS in the year 2014 with an aim to help the poor and backward community in the Diocese of Chikmagalur with the Aid for food, clothing, education, medical, housing, oldage and marriage with the interest earned from the Seed capital. During the year the we have disbursed Rs.1,28,000/- for housing, Rs.87,000/- for Education and Rs.1,16,000/- for Medical Expenses.

SUPPORT FROM CMSSS:

CMSSS reaches out to the unreached with financial assistance for Education, Medical, House repairs /Renovations and for Marriage expenses. During the year Rs.2,79,000/- was given towards Education, Rs.84,000/- Housing, Rs.8,000/- Marriage and Rs.1,33,000/- towards Medical.



JEEVAN JYOTHI FEDERATION (JJF)



Jeevan Jyothi Federation was registered in Hassan under the Co-operative Societies Act 1960. The federation has 17 Directors. 467 self help groups are affiliated to the federation with a membership of 5592 women. Rs.2,00,15,000/- loan is given to self help groups members for productive and non-productive purposes. Repayment of Rs.1,92,60,528/- is received.



Annual Day Celebration of the Federation:

1900 women participated in the Annual day celebration in the Government pre-university college, Kadur on 10-10-2022. Mr. Belliprakash the MLA of Kadur, the elected members of the local governance, religious leaders Fr. Patrick Johannes Rao, the Director of CMSSS Fr. Shantharaj R, the President of the Federation Smt. Laisa Joy were present. Rs.80,000/- was given to the members of the family of 16 cancer patients. The guests of honour encouraged and motivated the women to come together in large number with income generating activities other than non-productive activities and be self-reliant.





JEEVAN JYOTHI SRI SHAKTHI SOUHARDHA SAHAKARI SANGHA NIYAMITHA

Jeevan Jyothi Sri Shakthi Souhardha Sahakari Sangha Niyamitha is registered under the co-operative societies Act on 1997 with its Reg.No.5381/2021-22 dtd 20-12-2021.

The first general body meeting of Sahakari Souharda was held on April 25th, 2022, at CMSSS, B. Katihalli, Arsikere Road, Hassan. 35 members attended the meeting along with Mr. Chandrashekar, SDO of the Hassan region, and Fr. Shantharj R as the chief guests. The Board of Directors was formed 13 members with Mrs. Bhagyamary as the President and Mrs. Prameela Gunashekar, the Vice President. 1290 primary shareholders and 20 secondary share holders have been enrolled. The Apex Bank in Bangalore has given Rs 2,00,000/- for the development of the Souharda Sahakari office.



SAVE A FAMILY PLAN TRUST: FAMILY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM (FDP)

FDP is for a period of 6 years. 238 families are enrolled. 100 new partner families profiles are in process. 86 families are self-reliant. Orientation to families is given at cluster level. There are 14 clusters and 210 families have completed their 6 year plan and are receiving the assistance.
